Due to a greater demand to attend than beds available, kids will be accepted according to how many times they have attended Camp Courage & Camp Courage - Teens. Preference will be given to kids who have never attended or have attended only once. The information below should answer most questions you may have about Camp Courage & Camp Courage - Teens. Dates

Monday, June 3 – Friday, June 7, 2024.

Location

Lake Williamson Christian Center in Carlinville, IL (17280 Lakeside Dr, Carlinville, IL 62626).

Cost

There is no fee to attend Camp Courage & Camp Courage - Teens, yet we need financial support to make Camp happen. The full financial value of attending Camp Courage & Camp Courage - Teens is \$1,300 per camper. Every family with an accepted camper will be expected to make a donation to the best of their ability. Any donation to help with the expenses is greatly appreciated. The donation can be raised from family, friends, co-workers, etc., or it can be from personal family funds. In recent years, families have created successful Facebook fundraisers benefiting Annie's Hope and their children's campership. We will have a Mighty Cause link for everyone to share upon acceptance. **No child or teen is turned away simply because she/he/they/ze is unable to make a donation.** The amount of financial support helps determine how many campers may attend Camp Courage & Camp Courage - Teens.

Facilities

Lake Williamson is a campground about 80 minutes from the Annie's Hope office. The Carlinville, IL, site is situated northeast of St. Louis. Campers will have the opportunity to enjoy swimming, fishing in the pond, climbing the rock wall, testing their aim at archery, bonding with peers during team building games, creating arts & crafts, riding the zipline and experiencing the peace and community of sitting around a campfire! Campers will stay in air-conditioned cabins with bunk beds. All cabins and shower facilities are within the housing lodge. Each cabin has its own bathroom. The dining hall is in a separate building.

Activities

In addition to traditional summer camp experiences, we will host special activities each day.

Monday – Candle Lighting Ceremony

Campers, staff, and volunteers will have the opportunity to light a candle and share with the Camp about their special person or people who have died. Campers are invited to bring a photo to share and hang on the memory wall.

Tuesday – Pig's Trough

Campers will get their joyful fill of ice cream and toppings while eating out of a "Pig's Trough" without using their hands. Campers with dietary restrictions will be provided with their own ice creams that meet their needs.

Wednesday – Wacky Olympics

Wacky Olympics is our messy playtime. Campers compete in messy **SPACE**-themed activities. Past years' activities have involved water balloons, paint, shaving cream, color powder, and mud. Campers wear clothing that can get dirty and be **thrown away** at the end of Camp.

Wednesday – No Talent Show

The "No-Talent" Show is the time to show off talents & non-talents ... musical performances, dances, food eating contests, unique skills, etc. Each camper, individually or as a group, is strongly encouraged to do some kind of performance. Please help your potential camper(s) think about what they may like to do, and be sure to pack props, dress-up clothes, or items that will support their performance.

Thursday – Closing Campfire

On the final night, campers will participate in a luminary walk and our closing campfire, where they will have an opportunity to come together and reflect on their experience at Camp Courage & Camp Courage - Teens.

Meals

Three balanced meals are served daily, plus snacks at various times. The kitchen staff provides choices for campers with special dietary needs. If your child has particular restrictions or needs, please communicate these needs on the Health Examination Form before Camp begins. We request that no gum, candy, or food be brought by the campers.

Registration

Annie's Hope has openings to accept a limited number of campers. These camperships are filled based on prior attendance and on a first-come, first-serve basis. **To ensure consideration of the child, please read and complete the entire application by Friday, April 5, 2024. No applications will be accepted after Friday, May 3, 2024. All campers must complete a face-to-face interview with an Annie's Hope staff member by Friday, May 13, 2024.** Incomplete applications and lack of communication will delay review, interview, and possible acceptance.

If, for any reason, the camper wants or needs to withdraw from Camp Courage & Camp Courage - Teens, please let Annie's Hope know as soon as possible. There are often many campers on the waitlist who are eager to experience a week at Camp.

Check-In and Transportation

Camp check-in will take place on **Monday, June 3, 2024**, at Annie's Hope. **To ensure the safety of all campers, Annie's Hope requires all campers to attend check-in at Annie's Hope. Dropping off a camper at Lake Williamson Christian Center directly is not allowed.** For a timely departure to the campsite, **you must arrive at Annie's Hope at 10:00 AM for check-in.** Parents and guardians are **required to remain with their campers until the bus departs at 12:00 PM.** Please note that Annie's Hope may alter this time to ensure all campers' safe and efficient check-in.

It is the parent or guardian's responsibility to provide transportation to and from the pick-up location by the designated times. If transportation to Annie's Hope is absolutely not possible, please write a note on the Application Form. If we do not get a written message of the difficulty, we will assume the camper has transportation.

During the check-in process, a volunteer will be available to check-in the camper and help the camper onto the bus. This will provide time for the parent/guardian to visit the Camp Nurse to discuss any special needs and to drop off medications (process described in the Health Information Section of this packet).

All campers will ride together on the provided transportation. As such, we ask that you complete and submit the Transportation Release Form in the Application Packet by **Friday, April 5, 2024.**

Full, thorough completion of all paperwork, including signatures, is necessary to ensure safety on check-in day. Upon your camper's acceptance, more information regarding check-in procedures will be communicated to you.

The Last Day of Camp Courage & Camp Courage - Teens: Friday, June 7th, 2024.

You are invited to the Closing Ceremonies in Carlinville, IL, at Lake Williamson on Friday, June 7th, 2024. The campers will be anxious to see you and report about their Camp experience. If at all possible, please be there. **Each family can have up to two attendees at the closing ceremony.** Your child(ren) can ride home with you, but if no family members can attend the Closing Ceremonies, the camper will return to St. Louis on a bus and meet you at the Annie's Hope office at 2:30 PM prompt.

More information regarding the Closing Ceremonies will be communicated to you upon your camper's acceptance.

Health Information

The Health Examination Form is enclosed in the Application Packet. It is vitally important that this form be thoroughly & carefully completed, signed by a parent/guardian, and returned with the Application Packet. Blank spaces will delay acceptance and potentially deny acceptance. We strongly suggest a slow review before submitting. **If your camper has any changes in their health information after submitting the initial application (especially medications), please call Annie's Hope so we may update the health forms.** Our Camp Nurse must have these completed records prior to the start of Camp. In order to prepare medical records and to alert the staff to special situations, anyone arriving at check-in without a current Health Form on file will be sent home!

All medications must be presented to the Camp Nurse upon check-in. The nurse will be responsible for dispensing medications, including over-the-counter drugs. **ALL** medications brought to Camp must be in the original bottles/packaging with a legible prescription, dosage instructions, and the name of the prescribing physician; this includes any vitamins or over-the-counter medications. Campers are not allowed to keep any type of medicine in their cabins. **ALL** medications, including Tylenol and Ibuprofen, must be kept by the Camp Nurse.

Should an emergency arise with the camper, we will contact you with the information provided on the Health Examination Form. Please ensure that this information is accurate. Should additional medical care be necessary over and above that which the Camp Nurse can provide, we will first seek care at Carlinville Area Hospital, 20733 N Broad St, Carlinville, IL 62626, (217) 854-3141. If additional medical care is warranted, your camper will be transferred to a pediatric facility.

Camp Experience

You can do much to prepare the camper for going away to Camp, especially if it is the camper's first camp experience. Talking honestly about homesickness and what to expect can ease the transition from home to Camp. Please ensure your child has spent at least one night away from home before attending the Camp session. This will assist not only in the area of homesickness, but also prepares the child to care for her/him/them/hirself (e.g. showering, fixing hair, making the bed). Please express your confidence in your child's ability to cope with the five-day session and that the counselors are there to help. Please explain to your child that you expect her/him/them/hir to stay the whole time. Gaining independence from family is a developmental task that all must encounter at some point. Camp can be a positive step in the life of the camper.

Behavior Policy

To maintain a safe, fun, and enjoyable experience for all, no one is allowed, under any circumstances, to bring cigarettes, street drugs, vaping devices, marijuana, THC products, sniffing glues or compounds, knives, pocketknives, guns, or alcoholic beverages to Camp. **Anyone who chooses to bring any of these items, or anything else deemed inappropriate, to Camp Courage & Camp Courage - Teens will have her/his/their/hir parent or guardian notified and will be immediately sent home. The Behavior Agreement must be signed and submitted with the Application Packet by Friday, April 5, 2024.**

Cell phones are not permitted. They will be taken and returned to the camper as they leave on the last day.

Time-out discipline will be used for any minor behavior issues. Anyone who intentionally physically, socially, or emotionally harms another camper or staff person will be immediately withdrawn from the camp experience and the parent/guardian will be notified for pickup. There will be zero tolerance for misbehavior of any kind. This includes the use of foul language, disrespect of authority, and damage or theft of another's belongings. It is your responsibility to drive to Camp Courage & Camp Courage - Teens to take your camper home!

Important Numbers

The telephone is for emergency purposes only. Should you need to call because of an emergency, you may contact the following in the order described below:

Further, campers are not allowed to make or receive calls. **Please do not allow a cell phone to be taken to Camp.** A note or two sent from home to the camper is welcomed. An expression of confidence and encouragement will brighten any child's day. You may also drop these letters off at check-in for us to give to your camper throughout the week. There will be a camp "mailbox" at check-in to place camper letters in. Due to challenges with slow postal service, we discourage mail from being sent to the campsite directly.

Personal Property

Annie's Hope is not responsible for the loss of personal property at Camp Courage & Camp Courage - Teens. Campers are required to leave their iPods, iPads, MP3 players, Gameboys, Nintendo's, e-readers, DVDs, portable DVD players, jewelry, cash, and other valuables at home. Items found at Camp will be brought back to Annie's Hope's office, and if claimed within two weeks after the end of Camp, they will be returned to the owner. A Release for Responsibility of Valuables needs to be signed and submitted with the Application Packet.

When a loss is discovered, please alert the Camp Director or counselors immediately. It is the parent or guardian's responsibility to check the camper's belongings before leaving the pick-up point on the final day of Camp.

Camp Checklist and Laundry

A Camp Checklist to assist you in preparing your child for the camping experience is near the end of this packet. Should you need help in obtaining any of the necessary items for Camp Courage & Camp Courage - Teens, an additional Assistance Checklist has been included in the Application Packet. Please indicate on the form any items that you are unable to provide. Camp Courage & Camp Courage - Teens may be able to help obtain the items your camper needs. The form should be returned with the Application Packet by **Friday, April 5, 2024.**

Please mark all items with a permanent marker with your camper's name!!! Laundry service is not available. Please include a plastic bag, pillowcase, or laundry bag for soiled clothing.

Photo Release

For photos to be taken of your child documenting their fun and exciting camp experience, the Photographic Release must be signed and submitted with the Application Packet by **Friday, April 5, 2024**. A link for photos will be emailed to every accepted camper's parent/guardian 4 – 6 weeks after Camp ends.

Directions to Annie's Hope for Check-in

From Highway 40, West of 270: Go East on Highway 40 until Highway 270. Take 270 South for one exit to Manchester (Route 100). Take the Manchester exit to the east. Follow Manchester until you come to Berry (about 4 miles), (you will pass Ballas Rd, N. Kirkwood Rd., Woodlawn, & Sappington.) Berry is just inside Rock Hill City limits. If you cross Rock Hill Rd., you have already passed Berry. When you reach Berry, turn right (South). Follow Berry for about a mile and a half. You will come to the intersection of Berry and Lockwood. The Christian Life Center (CLC) will be on the right corner (white brick with red roof). Webster Hills United Methodist Church will be on the left. Turn right onto Lockwood and enter the CLC west parking lot from Lockwood (which is on the west side of the CLC building).

From Highway 40, East of Highway 270 yet, West of Brentwood: Go east on Highway 40 to McKnight Road south. Follow McKnight until it reaches Manchester. Turn right onto Manchester and head west about half a mile until you come to Berry Road. When you reach Berry, turn left (South). Follow Berry for about a mile and a half. You will come to the intersection of Berry and Lockwood. The Christian Life Center (CLC) will be on the right corner (white brick with red roof). Webster Hills United Methodist Church will be on the left. Turn right onto Lockwood and enter the CLC west parking lot from Lockwood (which is on the west side of the CLC building).

From Highway 40, East of Brentwood: Take Highway 40 west to Brentwood Blvd. Take Brentwood south. Follow until you come to Manchester Rd. Turn right onto Manchester. Proceed about two miles. Turn left onto Berry. Follow Berry for about a mile and a half. You will come to the intersection of Berry and Lockwood. The Christian Life Center (CLC) will be on the right corner (white brick with red roof). Webster Hills United Methodist Church will be on the left. Turn right onto Lockwood and enter the CLC west parking lot from Lockwood (which is on the west side of the CLC building).

From Highway 170 area NOT traveling on highways:

Get to Brentwood going south. Follow until you come to Manchester Rd. Turn right onto Manchester going westbound. Proceed about 2-3 miles. Turn left onto Berry. Follow Berry for about a mile and a half. You will come to the intersection of Berry and Lockwood. The Christian Life Center (CLC) will be on the right corner (white brick with red roof). Webster Hills United Methodist Church will be on the left. Turn right onto Lockwood (west) and enter the CLC west parking lot from Lockwood (which is the west side of the CLC building).

From Westbound 44: Exit Highway 44 at Berry. Go right (north). Follow until Berry meets Lockwood. The Christian Life Center (CLC) will be on the far, left corner (white brick with red roof). Webster Hills United Methodist Church will be on the far, right corner. Turn left onto Lockwood (west) and enter the CLC west parking lot from Lockwood (which is the west side of the CLC building).

From Eastbound 44: Follow as far as Big Bend exit. At the top of the ramp, turn right (east) and proceed to Berry Road stoplight. (You will pass Sappington Rd). At Berry Road, turn left and proceed over the railroad tracks and past the golf course on your left. At the Berry Road/Lockwood stop sign intersection, you will see the Christian Life Center (CLC) on the far, left corner (white brick with red roof). Webster Hills United Methodist Church will be on the far, right corner. Turn left onto Lockwood (west) and enter the CLC west parking lot from Lockwood (which is on the west side of the CLC building).

From Highway 270, South of Highway 44: Follow 270 until Highway 44. Go East on 44. Follow until Big Bend exit (right after Lindbergh exit). At the top of the ramp, turn right (east) and proceed to Berry Road stoplight. (you will pass Sappington Rd). At Berry Road, turn left and proceed over the railroad tracks and past the golf course on your left. At the Berry Road/Lockwood stop sign intersection, you will see the Christian Life Center (CLC) on the far, left corner (white brick with red roof). Webster Hills United Methodist Church will be on the far, right corner. Turn left onto Lockwood and enter the CLC west parking lot from Lockwood (which is on the west side of the CLC building).

From St. Louis City & West County area:

Start by heading east on Interstate 64 (I-64) East. You will cross the state border into Illinois. Use the left lanes to stay left on to Interstate 55 North towards Chicago. Stay on 55 North for approximately 60 miles. Take Exit 60 for IL Route 108 to Carlinville. Turn left onto IL Route 108 West towards Carlinville. Stay on IL-108 for 13 miles. Turn left onto IL Route 4 South. Lake Williamson will be on your right after approximately 2.5 miles. 17280 Lakeside Dr · Carlinville, IL 62626.

From the North County area:

Start by heading east I-270 East towards Chicago. Continue on I-270 East for approximately 30 miles. Take Exit 15B to merge onto I-55 North towards Chicago. Continue on I-55 North for 40 miles. Take Exit 60 for IL Route 108 to Carlinville. Turn left onto IL Route 108 West towards Carlinville. Stay on IL-108 for 13 miles. Turn left onto IL Route 4 South. Lake Williamson will be on your right after approximately 2.5 miles. 17280 Lakeside Dr · Carlinville, IL 62626.

From St. Charles County:

Start by heading east on Interstate 70 (I-70) East. Take Exit 232 to merge onto I-270 North towards Chicago. Continue on I-270 East for approximately 30 miles. Take Exit 15B to merge onto I-55 North towards Chicago. Continue on I-55 North for 40 miles. Take Exit 60 for IL Route 108 to Carlinville. Turn left onto IL Route 108 West towards Carlinville. Stay on IL-108 for 13 miles. Turn left onto IL Route 4 South. Lake Williamson will be on your right after approximately 2.5 miles. 17280 Lakeside Dr · Carlinville, IL 62626.

From Franklin County:

Start by heading east on Interstate 44 (I-44) East. Take exit 291A onto US-40 East, I-64 East toward Illinois. You will cross the state border into Illinois. Use the left lanes to stay left on to Interstate 55 North towards Chicago. Stay on I-55 North for approximately 60 miles. Take Exit 60 for IL Route 108 to Carlinville. Turn left onto IL Route 108 West towards Carlinville. Stay on IL-108 for 13 miles. Turn left onto IL Route 4 South. Lake Williamson will be on your right after approximately 2.5 miles. 17280 Lakeside Dr · Carlinville, IL 62626.

From South County area and Jefferson County:
