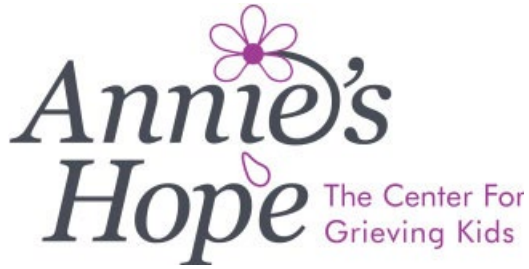
### OBJECTIVES OF THE WORKSHOP:
